Tendring CAMRA RambAle route 21

The Three Ships, Kirby-le-Soken to White Hart, Weeley Heath

Start: The Ship, Kirby-le-Soken
Finish: White Hart, Weeley Heath

Total Distance: 7.8 miles (12.6km)

The Ship, Kirby-le-Soken to the Essex Skipper, Frinton



Distance: 1.5 miles (2.4km)

Turn left out of the pub, cross over and take the path between numbers 46 and 48 through to Pyesand. Turn left on Pyesand then right into Horsey Road and take the path to the left after 38 through to Dugmore Avenue. Take the path roughly straight across between numbers 48 and 50 and when you reach the field follow the path diagonally to the left across the field. Once across this

first field you meet another footpath which runs left and right, and a permissive path that you want to take which runs roughly straight on, with hedges/trees to your left after the first section of this path. At the corner of the

field go through the gateway and through the gate opposite and turn right keeping the hedges on your right. After the next hedge line on your left turn left and follow the permissive path until you reach the path around the estate and turn right. Pass the first two left turns that lead to Bloomfield Avenue and Beverley Drive and take the next left (just before the bollards) and follow it until you reach Edenside, then go straight across.





After crossing Edenside follow the main path ignoring the first left to Riskin Close, then taking the right hand fork at the litter bin (if the bin is still there, else the right hand fork at the next path junction). Follow the path until you again reach Edenside (the road loops around) and turn right - you should be able to see the back of the Tesco. Follow the pavement until you reach Elm Tree Avenue where there is a crossing point slightly to your right. Cross there and take the path between Tesco and the Essex Skipper and there will be steps on your right to a pub entrance., or follow the path to the end to get to the St Helena shop in the Triangle shopping centre.

Essex Skipper to Lock and Barrel, Frinton-on-Sea

Distance: 1.1 miles (1.7km)

Depending which door you leave the pub by, and whether you visit the St Helena shop after the pub or not you need to get back to Elm Tree Avenue, which is either retracing your steps from the Tesco side door, or through the car park and turn right from the car park side door, or turn left out of the St Helena shop, walk through the Triangle shopping centre, and turn right at the road. Turn left on Elm Tree Avenue and follow the pavement. Take care crossing the road when you reach the mini-roundabout near the level crossing, and again take care when crossing the level crossing. Then just follow Connaught Avenue until you reach the Lock and Barrel. Note: you will be passing St Helena's book and music shops on the way down Connaught Avenue, and they have another more general shop on the right just beyond the Lock & Barrel.



Things to do in Frinton

Due to the timing of public transport there may be quite a bit of time available to visit the shops of Connaught Avenue. As well as the three St Helena shops marked as circles (with no fill colour) on this map. Frinton now also has an Adnams shop near the junction of Connaught Avenue and Church Walk - you will see it on the way to the Lock and Barrel. For sausage fans. Wrights butchers is near the southern most St Helena shop, and Wrights Deli is next to the Lock and Barrel if you fancy (and they still have left) one of their sausage rolls or scotch eggs. Many other shops are available, so it is important to make sure you are at the railway station in time to get a ticket, allowing extra time if you want to make sure of being part of a group save group. Times will be announced on the day, but assuming the train is at about 3pm, expect tickets to be purchased at around 14:50 for the train to Weeley. The station is about 0.5 miles (0.8km) from the Lock & Barrel

Weeley Station to White Hart

Distance: 1.1 miles (1.7km)

Use the footbridge to cross the tracks, then exit the station, take the steps up to the Weeley bypass bridge, and turn right. Then just follow the road until you reach the White Hart.
